

Glass:

- Glass can be recycled forever; it never wears out!
- Recycling glass reduces air pollution by 14-20%.
- A glass bottle thrown into the landfill today would still be here in the year 3000.
- You can operate a 100-watt light bulb for four hours from the energy saved by recycling one glass.
- One ton of glass saves about 9 gallons of fuel oil.
- To recycle glass, it must be taken to the Transfer Station. It cannot be collected curbside.

Recycling Tips:

- Use mugs instead of paper cups.
- Use cloth instead of napkins.
- Use rags instead of paper towels.
- But products in bull.

Paper:

- Recycling 1 ton of paper saves 17 trees and 7,000 gallons of water.
- Every ton of paper recycled saves 380 gallons of oil.
- It takes more than 500,000 trees to make newspapers Americans use in one day.
- Air pollution is saved up to 74% and water pollution by 35% when paper is recycled.
- Each person uses about 580 pounds of paper each year.
- Paper can be recycled curbside.

RECYCLING FUN FACTS

Aluminum Cans:

- Approx. 35 billion aluminum cans get thrown away each year.
- More aluminum is produced in the U.S. than any other country.
- Each pound of aluminum produces about 32 cans.
- About 113,204 aluminum cans are recycled each minute.
- By recycling aluminum cans, this reduces energy use by about 90%. The energy saved can run a TV for about 3 hours.
- Recycling aluminum cans also reduces air pollution by about 95%.
- Aluminum cans can be recycled curbside.
